MONDAY-THE OPENING DAY.

At 12 o'clock, April 22d, Lieutenstood at the north line of Oklahoma, watch in hand. Guards held a rope marking the line. When the noon hour came he turned to the bugler and told him to give the signal. The bugler blew the blast and immediately there sprang across the line with a loud yell and cheering, a thousand riders, urging their horses on at the fullest speed. Behind they left their wagons, family and supplies, expecting them to "ollow. Many a man had paid \$500 for a horse for this special occasion, for much depended upon the result of the race. Others rode a horse and took a second as a relay.

A party of the deputies moved upon a body of boomers concealed in the bushes car Guthrie and rounding them up drove them across the river. Leaping from their teams they fired off their guns and commenced turning up the soil, and set themselves forth as the owners of the very tlaims from which they had just driven the boomers.

The feeling tonight is intense and bitter against these men who took advantage of official position to violate the law and rights of the poor man and true settler. In regard to this there will be begun a bitter contest for the town lots and claims around Guthrie.

Boomers and Sooners: The Oklahoma Land Rush of 1889

In 1889, as many as 50 thousand settlers poured into Oklahoma hoping to stake claim to a portion of nearly two million acres opened for settlement by the U.S. Government. Many had campaigned the federal government to open the land for settlement and were known as Boomers. The land, formerly occupied by Native Americans, was considered Unassigned Lands after the federal government forcibly relocated many Native American tribes. On April 22, 1889, at noon sharp, a bugle sounded, and hopeful settlers surged across the territory line. The number of settlers surpassed available land and they soon realized that some snuck into Oklahoma ahead of the April 22nd open date.

This gave them a leg up on the law-abiding settlers and first in line for the most desirable land. Those early homestead seekers were known as Sooners.
